

CALL FOR U.S. PARTICIPATION IN EUROPEAN COMMISSION'S FP7 ON CCS

The [European Commission Seventh Framework Programme](#) (FP7) has issued the following calls for research and technology development (FP7) proposals related to carbon capture and storage (CCS) that are open to U.S. organizations.

[FP7-ENERGY-2010-1](#) allocates of €19 million as the indicative budget for ACTIVITY ENERGY.5: CO₂ CAPTURE AND STORAGE TECHNOLOGIES FOR ZERO EMISSION POWER GENERATION, on:

- AREA ENERGY.2010.5.1-1: Demonstration of advanced CO₂ capture concepts
- AREA ENERGY.2010.5.2-1: CCS - storage site characterization
- Area ENERGY.2010.5.2-2: Trans-national cooperation and networking in the field of geological storage of CO₂
- AREA ENERGY.2010.5.2-3: CCS – site abandonment

Application deadlines are 15 October 2009 at 17:00:00 (Brussels local time) and 11 March 2010 at 17:00:00 (Brussels local time) - 2nd deadline (for 2-stage procedure).

[FP7-ENERGY-2010-2](#) allocates €20 million as the indicative budget for ACTIVITY ENERGY.6: CLEAN COAL TECHNOLOGIES and CROSSCUTTING ACTIONS BETWEEN ACTIVITY 5 and 6, on:

- AREA ENERGY.2010.6.1-1: Efficiency improvement of oxygen-based combustion
 - AREA ENERGY.2010.5 & 6.2-1: Extending the value chain for greenhouse gas emissions
- Application deadline is 04 March 2010 at 17:00:00 (Brussels local time).

[FP7-OCEAN-2010](#) allocates €10.5 million for as the indicative budget for “ocean of tomorrow” research on:

- AREA OCEAN.2010-3: Sub-seabed carbon storage and the marine environment
- Application deadline is 14 January 2010 at 17:00:00 (Brussels local time).

This opportunity has been made possible under the [Implementing Agreement Between The Department of Energy of the United States of America and the European Commission for Non-Nuclear Energy Scientific and Technological Cooperation](#). Private companies, research institutions, industrial organizations, public colleges and universities, regional authorities, and individual researchers in the EU and Associated States are eligible.
