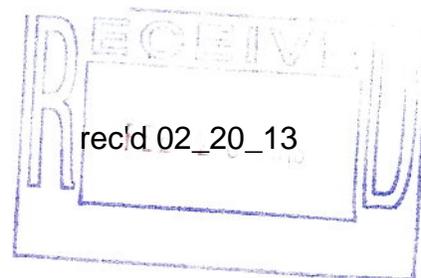

Dear Secretary Chu,
